NOTIFICATION

The National Law University Delhi had issued admission notice for the academic year 2020-21 on 14th January, 2020 with 50% horizontal reservations for the students of Delhi who passed their qualifying examinations from NCT of Delhi. The decision of the University was challenged in the Hon'ble Delhi High Court through W.P(C) 3454/2020 Balvinder Sangwan & Ors. Versus State (GNCT) of Delhi through Chief Secretary & Ors. and W.P.(C) 3170/2020 Pia Singh versus National Law University Delhi. The Hon'ble Delhi High Court passed an order on 29.06.2022 as under:

"Status quo ante as of the previous academic year shall be maintained for making admissions to the B.A.LL.B.(Five Year Programme) and LL.M (One Year Programme) in NLU Delhi, for the academic year 2020-21. The respondent No.3/NLU is directed to issue to public notice on or before 02.07.2020, informing the public at large about the decision taken above and granting a further period of one week from the date of issuance of public notice to enable interested candidates to submit their applications for admission. The redrawn schedule will not interfere with the entrance examinations that are to take place in August, 2020. The order shall be also be uploaded on the website of the NLU, Delhi forthwith."

As per orders of Hon'ble Delhi High Court, the University issued revised admission notice/ addendum in July 2020 to remove 50% horizontal reservations for students of Delhi in admission to B.A.LL.B.(Hons.) and LL.M. Programmes for the academic year 2020-21 and the seat matrix was rolled back for the Academic year 2019-2020. The matter is still pending in the Hon'ble Delhi High Court and admissions for academic year 2021-22 and 2022-23 were finalized as per the order of Hon'ble High Court. The admission notice for the academic session 2023-24 has also been issued accordingly.

The university notification of 14th January, 2020 pertaining to 50% domicile reservation for students of Delhi has become null and void for past 3 years due to orders of Hon'ble High Court. This issue was discussed in detail in meetings of university bodies and a decision has been taken to withdraw the Millolass notification.
