

This programme is a unique International collaboration that will be delivered by leading Indian and U.K. lawyers, scholars, and judges. It offers an opportunity to improve students' advocacy skills, guided by the best. The course focuses on human rights, gender justice, and vulnerable witnesses.

# **Course Objectives**

The course provides students with a unique opportunity to hone the fundamental skills of trial advocacy that can make or break a litigation career in its early years.

Students will gain confidence in trial advocacy, in handling vulnerable witnesses and in dealing with difficult issues of gender based violence in cases.

The majority of Indian law students gain significant experience of mooting. However, very few are able to demonstrate excellence in examination in chief, cross examination or legal speech making to future recruiters.

There are also limited opportunities for juniors to appear in court in their own capacity in their early years. As a result, juniors can struggle to distinguish themselves from their peers, may struggle to obtain work in their early years and may struggle to build a reputation in litigation.

Litigators also struggle to identify juniors with the day-today advocacy skills needed when recruiting into their Chambers.

The course and certification offer the opportunity for students to obtain unparalleled training and stand out from their peers in both India & London.

Course is a highly selective and exclusive — maximum number of 25 students. No course fees but commitment to attend on all days is required.

The small course size will enable participants to network with and obtain highly individualised feedback from their trainers in a supportive environment. The course is designed to increase confidence in public speaking and all students will be supported to become the best advocates they can be.

### Course Programme

The course will run from Thursday 21st November 2019 -Tuesday 26th November 2019.

The timings will be 10am - 5pm daily.

Students will be taught by India's pioneering human rights jurists in collaboration with barristers from London's leading Civil Liberties and Human Rights Chambers (Doughty Street), London's leading Human Rights NGO (JUSTICE) and a specialist intermediary for vulnerable witnesses.

Students will obtain intensive advocacy training throughout this time. Training will be through multiple fictitious practical exercises in Examination-in-Chief, Cross Examination, Speech Making and how to address the court.

Work will be in small groups. Each student will be given the opportunity to practice advocacy skills, obtain individualised feedback & network with leading Delhi based lawyers from India and London based lawyers in the UK.

Exercises will use fictitious case papers in the context of gender justice, vulnerable witnesses and challenging global human rights issues – in collaboration with iProBon Teaching will be through a mix of demonstrations, discussion



Students implement the knowledge they have gained in a Mock Trial on last day of course (Tuesday 26th November 2019) judged by practising lawyers from the Indian Supreme Court and eminent judges.

Course will also include academic and critical seminars on Law, Power & Fairness, Ethical Challenges when Dealing with Vulnerable Witnesses & Intersectional Discrimination and the concept of 'Vulnerability' in Indian legislation.

#### **Eligibility for Course:**

The Course is open to all 3rd, 4th and 5th year students, enrolled bona fide on a regular basis in a 5-year BA/LLB Undergraduate

The Course is also open to all 3rd year students enrolled bona fide on a regular basis in a 3-year Post Graduate LLB Law Course

#### How to Apply:

A maximum number of 25 participants will be accepted.

Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis. Interested persons are therefore encouraged to apply as early as possible in order to avoid disappointment.
