- Objective and purpose of higher education in law: are we any closer towards justice-oriented legal education?
- The Ivory Towers of National Law Universities: Three decades of experimentation in legal education

- The reality and myth of a 'Level playing field': Liberalisation of legal industry and the possibility of triggering a strong flow of investment with increased demand for finance, corporate and capital market advice; Effect of liberalisation on domestic firms and lawyers- its impact on graduate recruitments.
- Legal industry in the shadow of technology: technological replacements in the legal industry and its impact on the business law curriculum and recruitments.
- Syncing legal curriculum with global business law: how do we make the current legal curriculum relevant to the everchanging global landscape of business and the law?
- Breaking the glass ceilings: women in law and business, career advancement support for women seeking re-entry in the legal industry.
- Regulating entry to the legal profession: Mandatory practical training as a necessary requirement for qualification to the Bar; centralised selection process for law firms as practised in foreign jurisdictions
- Looking beyond business: Industry engagement with diversity and pro-bono work and corporate social responsibility.
