- (a) Abstracts should not exceed 350 words. (word format)
- (b) Font and Font Size: Times New Roman, 12, Line spacing 1.5 and Alignment 'justify'.
- (c) Abstract should mention the following specific details on the front page:
 - Name of the Author
 - Affiliation
 - Designation
 - Contact Number
 - Email Id
 - Title of the Submission

(a) Length of full paper : Not more than 3,500 words (excluding footnotes and title)

(b) Font and Font Size : Times New Roman, 12, Line spacing 1.5 and Alignment

(c) Footnotes : Font 'Times New Roman', Font Size 10, line spacing 1.5

- (d) Follow the Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation (20th Edition) for footnoting.
- (f) Policy papers will be eligible only if they cover important and contemporary issues.
- (g) Submissions must be original and not yet published.
- (h) Co-authorship is allowed.
- i) Payment of Registration fees is mandatory for all the presenters and attendees.
